## Defining CCBHCs

- CCBHCs are specially-designated clinics that provide a comprehensive range of mental health and substance use services.
- CCBHCs serve anyone who walks through the door, regardless of their diagnosis and insurance status.
- CCBHCs meet stringent criteria regarding timeline of access, quality reporting, staffing and coordination with social services, criminal justice and education systems.
- CCBHCs receive flexible funding to support the real costs of expanding services to fully meet the need for care in their communities.



### 2 types of CCBHC sites

### **CCBHC sites funded by SAMHSA grants**

- Focus on a single or small number of target populations (veterans, homeless, etc.). Does not require certification as a CCBHC meeting full set of CCBHC requirements. Often using grant dollars to build infrastructure.
- Funded through SAMHSA grants (Typically \$1 million/year for four years)



### **CCBHC State Demonstration sites**

- Meet all CCBHC requirements during or soon after first year of involvement in State Demonstration.
- CCBHC State Demonstration sites are funded through Medicaid Prospective Payment System (PPS), as a Medicaid payment, outside of the sub-capitation received by Michigan CMHs, based on the number of days of service provided to CCBHC enrollees

Services that must be made available to all individuals, either directly provided by a CCBHC clinic, or through contracted designated collaborating organizations (DCOs):

- 1. Crisis mental health services, including 24-hour emergency crisis intervention services, and crisis stabilization.
- 2. Screening, assessment, and diagnosis, including risk assessment.
- 3. Patient-centered treatment planning or similar processes, including risk assessment and crisis planning.
- 4. Outpatient mental health and substance use services.

- 5. Outpatient clinic primary care screening and monitoring of key health indicators and health risk.
- 6. Targeted case management.
- 7. Psychiatric rehabilitation services.
- 8. Peer support and counselor services and family supports.
- 9. Intensive, community-based mental health care for members of the armed forces and veterans, particularly those members and veterans located in rural areas.


# Integrating CCBHC into state's core Medicaid program

A growing number of states are moving to implement the CCBHC model — similar to other value-based or alternative payment models, such as Michigan's capitated payments to its PIHPs and CMHSPs — independently via a state plan amendment or Medicaid waiver.

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
### CCBHCs across the country

As of November 2023, more than 500 CCBHCs and CCBHC grantees are operating in 48 states, plus Washington DC and Puerto Rico.



### **CCBHCs across Michigan**

- 30 sites involved in Michigan's CCBHC State Demonstration Initiative
- I3 sites in Year 1 of the State Demonstration (10/22-9/23)
- I7 additional sites added in Year 2 of the State Demonstration (10/23-9/24)
- 22 of Michigan's 46 CMHSPs are CCBHCs



### **CCBHC Impact: Nationally**

- 2 million people served through CCBHCs;
   180,000 increase (9% increase)
- 27 new staff positions created per site as a result of becoming a CCBHC
- 72% reduction in hospitalizations
- 41% reduction in homelessness
- 60.3% less time in jails

### **CCBHC Impact: Michigan**

- Served 62,826 Michiganders
- 89% were covered by Medicaid
  - 65% of these had traditional Medicaid
  - 24% of these had Healthy Michigan
  - 11% other Medicaid coverage
- 11% did not have Medicaid
- 23% had primary or secondary SUD dx (with 3.2% having a primary SUD dx)
- 26% had mild to moderate mental health conditions

Eliminating barriers to participation & ensuring sustainability

- CMHA working with MDHHS to revise the definitions of required services, most notably mobile crisis services
- MDHHS, Senator Stabenow, National Council, and CMHA advocating for funds to cover costs of serving those not covered by Medicaid
- CMHA, MDHHS, Governor, and Legislative allies working to ensure sound and permanent CCBHC funding 19
